
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350 cows and serve their own butter and free-range eggs for breakfast.

Under-10s can even ride the Shetland ponies, while there are also pigmy goats, plus an outdoor playground, trampolines and a pingpong table.

One luxurious room holds a fourposter bed, a bathroom with claw-foot tub and walk-in shower, and a full kitchen, while the other incorporates a mezzanine lounge area; both can accommodate families of four.

With the rolling hills and valleys of the Suisse Normande nearby, it is a perfect base for a longer stay, and also incorporates a self-catering gîte, let with up to five bedrooms.

Château de La Mouchère

This grand 18th-century château lies deep in the time-forgotten hills of Normandy's Perche region, half a mile down its own leafy private lane and six miles south east of the village of Bellême.

Run by a very charming Anglo-French couple, both retired academics and enthusiastic dog owners - pets welcome! - it's large enough to host full-sized wedding receptions. Normally, though, its five b&b rooms are peaceful havens, with beautiful wooden floors, Tiffany lamps and abundant deco trimmings - except for a set of Wisdens, almost nothing dates from after the Second World War. Stroll through the orchards and across the lawns on a summer's evening, then step inside for an aperitif and - by arrangement - home-cooked dinner. Rooms €90-€140, including breakfast; dinner, including wine, €30. La Mouchère, 61130 Saint-Cyr-la-Rosière, Eure (0033 2 33 83 02 99; lamouchere.

Le Vieux Château le Renouard

The name says it all; this château is seriously old, dating from the ninth century. It simply oozes history: Henry I of England stayed here; two kings of Scotland were born here; and the Balliol family lived here for seven centuries. Still sporting medieval frescoes and fireplaces, it has been restored to hold four palatial b&b rooms, complete with four-poster

The friendly English owner prepares breakfast (and dinner, by arrangement) using fresh dairy produce from the surrounding Pays d'Auge – the little village of Camembert itself is just five miles east.

Hôtel Tanquerey de la Rochaisière

A "hotel" in the very French sense of being a graceful private residence, this exquisite town house is tucked down a peaceful side-street less than 200yd from Coutances' Gothic cathedral (celebrated by Henry Adams as being "above mercy"). While its precise age

One of the two guest rooms even has its own "cabinet of curiosities", with fine-art prints and cases of butterflies, while both share a sitting room, breakfast parlour and garden courtyard.

La Laiterie de Tocqueville

Despite its urbansounding address, and
setting in a former dairy
factory, this is a quiet rural b&b,
15 miles east of Cherbourg's ferry
port. Until 1978, 50 people worked
here; now it has been repurposed to
hold light, inviting guest rooms.

While much of the original brick and stone remains intact, playful touches include turning intricate old pipes into decorative features, using cardboard furniture in what was once the box room, and installing contemporaneous etched-glass panels – a blend of industry and modernity epitomised by the poster for Charlie Chaplin's *Modern Times*.

Breakfast is served in the sunny conservatory in summer, using the Val d'Isère butter once manufactured on site, but dinner isn't offered.
